**- Institutional Type and Direct Governing Authority:**

TDTU is a public university, operating under the **autonomous mechanism in personnel and financial management** (since 2008 when it came under the *Vietnam General Confederation of Labour*); regular expenditures and capital construction investment are balanced by the University itself, without using state budget capital. The direct governing authority of the University is the Vietnam General Confederation of Labour.

**- Summary of the establishment history and development of the University:**

TDTU originated as Ton Duc Thang Private Technology University, established under Decision No. 787/TTg dated September 24, 1997 of the Prime Minister and founded

by the Ho Chi Minh City Federation of Labour, with the objective of *“Implementing Programme 17/TU and Directive 13 of the Ho Chi Minh City Party Committee on training, retraining, and enhancing the professional qualifications and skills of the city’s labor force; developing human resources to meet the demands of industrialization and modernization; contributing to the development of talents and human resources; and expanding scientific and applied research activities serving production and socio-economic development in Ho Chi Minh City, the southern provinces, and across the country.”*

In order to expand its scale, strengthen financial management, increase competitiveness, and meet the growing demand for higher education from society and the labor market, the Prime Minister issued Decision No. 18/2003/QĐ-TTg dated January 28, 2003 to transform TDTU’s legal entities and change its name to become Ton Duc Thang Semi-Public University directly under the Ho Chi Minh City People’s Committee. On June 11, 2008, the Prime Minister issued Decision No. 747/QĐ-TTg changing Ton Duc Thang Semi-public University into Ton Duc Thang University governed by the Vietnam General Confederation of Labour.

During the period 2012-2013, in the context of implementing Resolution 29-NQ/TW of the Central Committee *“on the fundamental and comprehensive renovation of education and training, meeting the requirements of industrialization and modernization in the socialist-oriented market economy and international integration,”* TDTU identified its strategic orientation to become a research university. The University developed and promulgated a corresponding development plan, promoted university autonomy, improved the quality of training and scientific research, gradually integrated internationally, and contributed to the goal of enhancing the quality of higher education in Vietnam. To fully exercise the University’s autonomy, on January 29, 2015, the Prime Minister approved the pilot scheme to renovate the operational mechanism of Ton Duc Thang University issued under Decision No. 158/QĐ-TTg. The goal of Ton Duc Thang University is determined that *“Ton Duc Thang University actively mobilizes, and uses the resources of the University and society reasonably and efficiently (without using state budget capital) to develop it into a quality research-oriented university in the region and the world, as well as to ensure that participants from the policy beneficiaries and poor households have opportunities to access the higher education programmes”*.

During the period 2019-2024, TDTU continuously innovated and developed strongly in education, scientific research, and innovation. With the companionship of the University’s leadership, lecturers, staff, and students, the University has gradually affirmed its position, improved the quality of training and university governance towards modernity, autonomy, and integration. The University conducted a review of its third five-year development plan and formulated and promulgated its **fourth five-year development plan (2025-2030)**. To concentrate resources for implementing the development strategy, TDTU has comprehensively updated its **Educational Philosophy, Mission, Vision, Goal, Slogan, Core Values, and Code of Conduct**, specifically:

- **Educational Philosophy:** “Liberal Education for Comprehensive Human Development”;

- **Mission:** “Education, Research, and Creativity for the Comprehensive Development of Humans and Society”;
- **Vision:** “Becoming an outstanding institution in education and research, aiming to meet societal needs, and fostering human development”;
- **Goal:** “Developing into a world-class research University”;
- **Slogan:** “Inspiring knowledge, shaping the future”;
- **Core values:** “Quality and Trust”;
- **Code of Conduct:** “Democracy, Fairness, Effectiveness, and Devotion”.

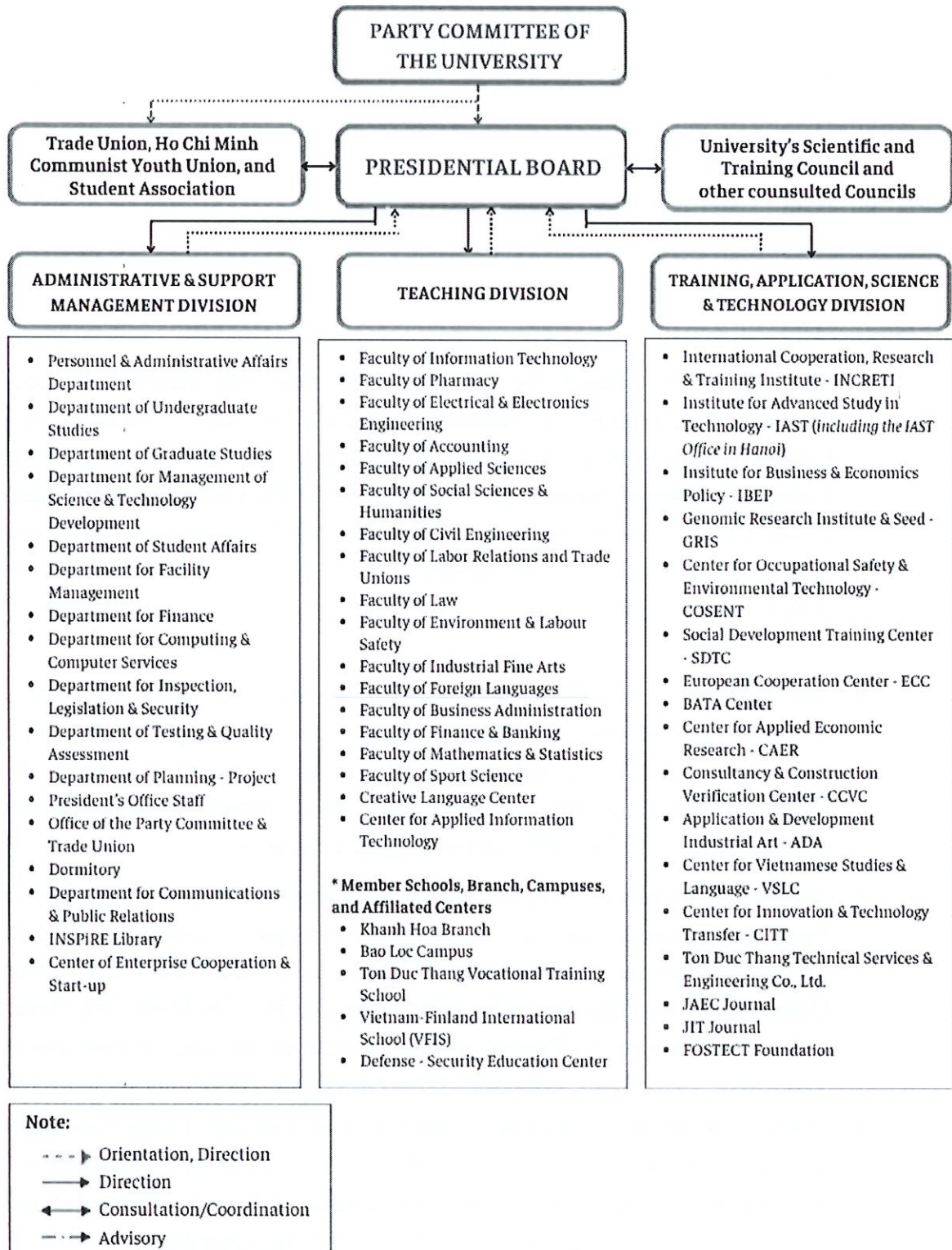
**- Organizational Structure:**

The organizational structure of the University as of December 31, 2025, is currently implemented in accordance with the regulations applicable to a public university, including:

- The University Council for the 2021-2026 term was established according to Decision No. 2459/QĐ-TLĐ dated April 14, 2021 by the Presidium of the Vietnam General Confederation of Labour. According to the Establishment Scheme, the University Council consists of 21 members. At the time of its establishment, the Council had 17 members until the Council ended its operation on December 31, 2025 with 18 members. From January 1, 2026, the University Council completed its duties, ceased operations, and handed over the work and documents to the President of the University.
- The Presidential Board of the University for the 2021-2026 term consists of 4 members (1 President and 3 Vice Presidents). As of January 1, 2026, they continue to perform their duties and exercise the authority assigned to them during the transition period, pending consolidation of the University’s leadership mechanism in accordance with the 2025 Law on Higher Education.
- The Party Committee of the University is a grassroots Party Committee under the Party Committee of the Ho Chi Minh City People’s Committee. The Executive Committee for the 2025-2030 term has 13 members. The Trade Union of the University is a grassroots trade union under the Ho Chi Minh City Federation of Labour, comprising 2 affiliated grassroots trade unions and 34 trade union groups. The current Executive Committee of the University’s Trade Union has 15 members.
- The Ho Chi Minh Communist Youth Union of Ton Duc Thang University for the 2025–2027 term consists of 25 members of the Executive Committee. Currently, the University Youth Union directly manages 17 Faculty/Campus Youth Union organizations and 12 grassroots-level Youth Union branches.

- The Vietnam Student Association at Ton Duc Thang University for the 2025-2028 term consists of 25 members of the Executive Committee. Currently, the University Student Association directly oversees 18 Faculty/Campus Student Association Chapters.
- As of December 31, 2025, the University's organizational structure comprised 59 affiliated/subordinate units. On January 1, 2026, the University Council completed its duties and ceased operations in accordance with the 2025 Law on Higher Education.

**- Regulations on administrative, human resources and financial management:**

To ensure stability, effectively implement its missions and functions, and achieve development goals in line with the strategic orientation, the University has developed and promulgated Quality Objectives and Academic Year Plans at both the university and unit levels; organized Annual Work Briefing Conference to disseminate and assign key missions of the academic year to units, focusing on stabilizing the organizational structure and establishing a legal framework; and given attention to recruitment, training, admissions, student affairs, accreditation, testing, scientific research, digitalization, international cooperation, and other activities aligned with the implementation of the University's development plan and Quality Objectives. In 2025, the University reviewed, updated, and promulgated regulations on personnel, training, scientific research, and governance activities, including Regulations on working hours, rest periods, and personal leave for University employees; Regulations on standards, duties, and working conditions for full-time lecturers; Regulations on scientific research activities and academic integrity; updates and amendments to the University's internal expenditure regulations and income regulations; as well as various regulations related to academic affairs, lecturer management, and other educational activities. These regulations are publicly disclosed on the University's official documents portal.

**- Policies for attracting and developing lecturers, administrators, and staff:**

Based on the University's Job Position Scheme and human resource development plan, the University has developed recruitment plans and policies to attract highly qualified

personnel. In 2025, TDTU continued to consolidate leadership and management positions at the Head/Deputy Head level of units and professional managerial staff (Head/Deputy Head of Division; Head/Deputy Head of Sub-Division) in several affiliated/subordinate units of the University. The University also continued to implement the plan to review and supplement the planning of managerial staff for the 2021-2026 term and to prepare the planning of managerial staff for the 2026-2031 term in order to ensure leadership and management resources for both the current and upcoming terms.

As of 2025, the University has completed three five-year development plans: the first (2008-2013), the second (2014-2019), and the third (2019-2024); and is now implementing the fourth plan (2025-2030).

TDTU bears the responsibility of fostering human development and serving the nation of Vietnam by educating high-quality human resources for Ho Chi Minh City and the entire country, with particular emphasis on training workers and laborers. It also conducts increasingly effective applied and scientific research to support the nation's long-term growth; commits to greater contributions toward a prosperous, stable, and sustainable Vietnam; and helps create a civilized, peaceful world.

The long-term goal of TDTU is to become a research university, while simultaneously fulfilling its role in training, retraining, fostering, and enhancing professional qualifications and skills to meet the demand for high-quality human resources in the process of industrialization and modernization of Vietnam. To achieve this goal, TDTU's quality policies are as follows:

1. Leadership and management: ensuring a streamlined, transparent and democratic management system;

2. Human resources: recruiting, training, maintaining and developing human resources with expertise, high scientific level, integrity, professionalism and responsibility;

3. Finance, facilities and information technology system: operating a sustainable and transparent financial model; investing and developing facilities to ensure modernity, completeness and specialization; accelerating digital transformation to develop smart services that promptly support the implementation of strategic goals at each developmental stage;

4. Training, scientific and technological activities: continuously innovating to meet the needs of stakeholders; developing specific in-depth research fields, effectively contributing to local, national and international development;

5. Connecting and serving the community: enhancing domestic and international communication about TDTU; continuously expanding cooperation relationships with domestic and foreign partners and networks including enterprises, professional associations, universities, governmental and non-governmental organizations to enhance the position and prestige of the University.
